

The Doctrine of the Holy Spirit - Part 8

Title: Being led by the Holy Spirit.



Text: Luke 1:35 KJV:

35 And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

The ministry of the Holy Spirit, as it relates to the Savior.

From his bodily conception to his final ascension, the Lord Jesus Christ was led by the Holy Spirit.

The Savior was begotten by the Holy Spirit.

Lk. 1:35 KJV:

35 And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Mt. 1:18-20 KJV:

18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost.

19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not willing to make her a public example, was minded to put her away privily.

20 But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost.

Conclusion:

Thus the real Father of Christ's body was the Holy Spirit, and the real miracle wasn't in the Savior's birth, but in his supernatural conception.

The Savior was anointed by the Holy Spirit.

Mt. 3:16 NLT:

16 After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and settling on him.

Lk. 4:18 NLT:

**18 “The Spirit of the LORD is upon me,
for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released,
that the blind will see,
that the oppressed will be set free,**

Acts 10:38 NLT:

38 And you know that God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. Then Jesus went around doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

Heb. 1:9 NLT:

9 You love justice and hate evil.
Therefore, O God, your God has anointed you,
pouring out the oil of joy on you more than on anyone else.”

The Savior was **Anointed** by the Holy Spirit, as we have read in these aforementioned bible verses.

The word Anointed in the Hebrew language, can be used to mean:

Suk:

Implying a penetration power.

This word is only found 9 times throughout the bible.

Mashah:

Which comes from the **Hebrew word Mashiah**, known in the English language, as the word “Messiah.”

Messiah: Means the Anointed One.

Hence: Jesus Christ is the “Anointed One!”

The word Anointed in the Greek language, can be used to mean:

Aleipho:

Which is comparable to (Suk) which means to rub, to cover over.

Mt. 6:17 NLT:

17 But when you fast, comb your hair and wash your face.

Chrio:

From which comes the title of Christ. It's the counterpart of Messiah.

Lk. 4:18 NLT:

**18 “The Spirit of the LORD is upon me,
for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released,
that the blind will see,
that the oppressed will be set free,**

Whom orders the anointing?

God orders the Anointing!

1 Sam. 9:16 NLT:

16 “About this time tomorrow I will send you a man from the land of Benjamin. Anoint him to be the leader of my people, Israel. He will rescue them from the Philistines, for I have looked down on my people in mercy and have heard their cry.”



Jesus was anointed by the Holy Spirit.



As told by Matthew.

Mt. 3:16 NLT:

16 After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and settling on him.

The book of Hebrews.

Heb. 1:9 NLT:

9 You love justice and hate evil.
Therefore, O God, your God has anointed you,
pouring out the oil of joy on you more than on anyone else.”

As told by Luke.

Lk. 4:18 NLT:

The book of Acts.

Acts 10: 38 NLT:

38 And you know that God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. Then Jesus went around doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

The Savior was sealed by the Holy Spirit.

Sealed, is the Greek word: Sphragizo.

In the Greek culture, the seal had great legal significance, when stamped on possessions.

The seal indicated ownership and guarded the possession against theft.

Moreover, on a document the seal authenticated the message and conveyed the authority of the one whom stamped it.

As told by John.

Jn. 6:27 NLT:

27 But don't be so concerned about perishable things like food. Spend your energy seeking the eternal life that the Son of Man can give you. For God the Father has given me the seal of his approval."

The seal here demonstrated the Son's identification with both - Father and Spirit.

It also spoke of his genuineness, value, and authority.

The Savior was led by the Holy Spirit.

Mt. 4:1 NLT:

The Temptation of Jesus

1 Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted there by the devil.

The word "**led**" in this verse, comes from the **Greek word; Anago**, which means:

To bring, lead carry, or to take up.

The Savior was empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Mt. 12:28 NLT:

28 But if I am casting out demons by the Spirit of God, then the Kingdom of God has arrived among you.

Phil. 2:5-8 NLT:

5 You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had.

6 Though he was God,
he did not think of equality with God
as something to cling to.

7 Instead, he gave up his divine privileges;
he took the humble position of a slave
and was born as a human being.
When he appeared in human form,

8 he humbled himself in obedience to God
and died a criminal's death on a cross.

While on Earth, Christ abstained from using his divine attributes, such as omnipresence and omniscience, in an independent manner. Instead, he chose to rely entirely on the Holy Spirit for strength and guidance.



Jesus was filled by the Holy Spirit.

As told by John.

Jn. 3:34 NLT:

34 For he is sent by God. He speaks God's words, for God gives him the Spirit without limit.

As told by Luke.

Lk. 4:1 NLT:

The Temptation of Jesus

1 Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan River. He was led by the Spirit in the wilderness

The words “filled” and “full” simply refer to control. Therefore, the Savior was completely under the control of the Holy Spirit while on Earth.



The Savior sorrowed in the Holy Spirit.

As told by John.

Jn. 11:33 KJV:

33 When Jesus therefore saw her weeping, and the Jews also weeping which came with her, he **groaned in the spirit**, and was **troubled**,

Let's break down this verse in the Greek language, so that we may appreciate, the true meaning of this verse.

Groaned; the **Greek word “embrimadmai”** means the agitation of the mind as grief, to be greatly moved or agitated.

Spirit, the **Greek word Pneuma**, signifies disturbance caused by grief or indignation.

Troubled; the **Greek word “diatarrasso”** means to disturb greatly.

The Savior rejoiced in the Holy Spirit.

As told by Luke.

Lk. 10:21 NLT:

21 In that hour Jesus rejoiced in spirit, and said, **I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes: even so, Father; for so it seemed good in thy sight**

The Savior offered himself at Calvary through the Holy Spirit.



Heb. 9:14 NLT:

14 How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

The Savior was raised from the dead by the Holy Spirit.

Rom. 1:4 NLT:

4 and he was shown to be the Son of God when he was raised from the dead by the power of the Holy Spirit. He is Jesus Christ our Lord.

1 Pet. 3:17-19 KJV:

17 For it is better, if the will of God be so, **that ye suffer for well doing, than for evil doing.**

18 For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, **being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit:**

19 By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison;

Verse 17:

By suffering for the injustice, that may be rendered upon us, we become more “Christ-like” because He suffered for sins that He also didn’t commit.

Verse 18:

The reward for suffering with Christ, is to be quickened by the Spirit. **Immediately upon releasing this body, we are united with the Father through the Holy Spirit.**

The Savior commanded his disciples after his resurrection through the Holy Spirit.

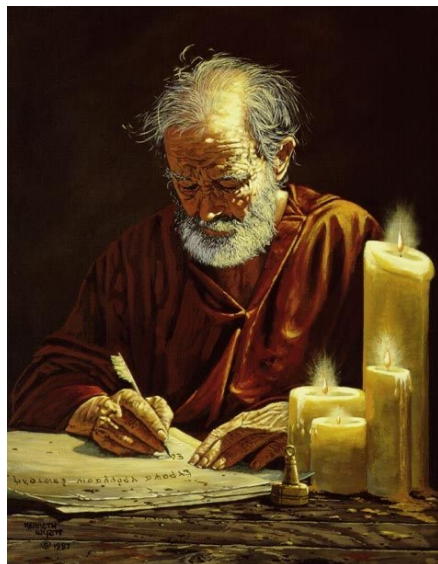
Acts 1:2 KJV:

2 Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:

1. The correct language is “had charged the apostles whom he had chosen.”
2. Jesus chooses his church leaders.
3. The Holy Spirit serves as our “line of communication” with our Lord.
4. All the work Jesus performed during his public ministry. The ministry was accomplished through the Holy Spirit.

Jn. 3:34 KJV:

34 For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him.



The Savior will someday return and raise the dead in Christ through the Holy Spirit.

Rom. 8:11 KJV:

11 But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.

1. The Holy Spirit raised Jesus from the dead.
2. In this verse, there's a transfer of names from Jesus to Christ.
3. The name of Jesus is now Christ, the head of the Church.
4. Jesus points to Himself, Christ (points to us)!
5. His proper name relates to his person, the other, as an appellative, to his office.
6. Shall also quicken your mortal bodies—rather, he shall quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.
7. Our spirit life, right now has eternal life.
8. Our bodies may succumb to the dust of the earth, but at the will of the Holy Spirit, they will be resurrected someday, following the pattern of our Lord Jesus.

The point of this particular section of our study should be painfully obvious. If the sinless Son of God found it necessary to depend totally upon the Holy Spirit to form every word and guide every step, how much more is this absolutely vital for us.

How do I ask Jesus to come into my life?



How do we get right with God, regardless of my sins?

Lord Jesus, I ask You to please come into my life, and to forgive me of all my sins, and I ask You to become my Lord and Savior, from this day forward.
