TITLE: JESUS IS GOD.

TEXT: MT. 22:42 NIV:

42 "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose son is he?"
"The son of David," they replied.

1. Introduction:

A. To the **(Artist)**, HE is the one Altogether Lovely:

SONG OF SOLOMON 5:16 NIV:

16 His mouth is sweetness itself; he is altogether lovely. This is my beloved, this is my friend, daughters of Jerusalem.

B. To the **(Architect)**, HE is the Chief Cornerstone:

1 PET. 2:6 NIV:

6 For in Scripture it says: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

C. To the **(Astronomer)**, HE is the Sun of Righteousness:

Mal. 4:2 NIV:

2 But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays. And you will go out and frolic like well-fed calves.

D. To the **(Baker)**, HE is the Bread of Life:

Jn. 6:35 NIV:

35 Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

E. To the (Banker), HE is the Hidden Treasure:

Mt. 13:44 NIV:

The Parable of the Hidden Treasure

44 "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.

F. To the (Builder), HE is the Sure Foundation:

Isa. 28:16 NIV:

16 So this is what the Sovereign LORD says: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone for a sure foundation; the one who relies on it will never be stricken with panic.

G. To the (Carpenter), HE is the Door:

Jn. 10:7 NIV:

7 Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep.

H. To the (Doctor), HE is the Great Physician:

Jer. 8:22 NIV:

22 Is there no balm in Gilead? Is there no physician there? Why then is there no healing for the wound of my people?

I. To the **(Educator)**, HE is the New and Living Way:

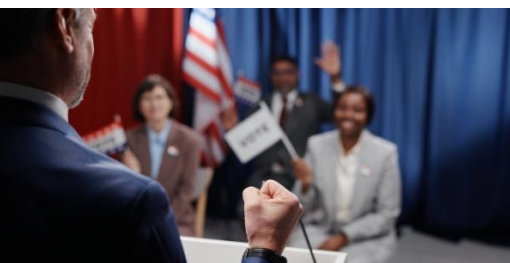
Heb.10:20 NIV:

20 by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain,
that is, his body,

J. To the **(Farmer)**, HE is the Sower and the Lord of Harvest:

Lk. 10:2 NIV:

12 I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than
for that town.



2. Examining Old Testament Theophanies:

- A. **A Theophany, is a Pre-Bethlehem appearance of Christ Jesus....** i.e. The Recurring Angel of the Lord, in scriptures!
- B. No regular (**Angel**) can redeem man!

Gen. 48:16 NIV:

16 the Angel who has delivered me from all harm may he bless these boys. May they be called by my name and the names of my fathers Abraham and Isaac, and may they increase greatly on the earth."

- C. A barren couple prays, and they are answered that they will have children.

Judges 13:8 NIV:

8 Then Manoah prayed to the LORD: "Pardon your servant, Lord. I beg you to let the man of God you sent to us come again to teach us how to bring up the boy who is to be born."

MANOAH, the father of the child, is informed by the angel that his name is "**Secret.**"

The word (**Secret**) translated means: Wonderful

ISA. 9:6 NIV:

6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.



D. HE appeared to (Hagar) Abraham's Egyptian wife:

Gen. 16:7-14 NIV :

7 The **angel of the LORD found Hagar** near a spring in the desert; it was the spring that is beside the road to Shur.

8 And he said, "Hagar, slave of Sarai, where have you come from, and where are you going?" "I'm running away from my mistress Sarai," she answered.

9 Then the angel of the LORD told her, "Go back to your mistress and submit to her."

10 The angel added, "I will increase your descendants so much that they will be too numerous to count."

11 The angel of the LORD also said to her: "You are now pregnant and you will give birth to a son. You shall name him Ishmael, for the LORD has heard of your misery.

12 He will be a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility toward all his brothers."

13 She gave this name to the LORD who spoke to her: "You are the God who sees me," for she said, "I have now seen the One who sees me."

14 That is why the well was called Beer Lahai Roi; it is still there, between Kadesh and Bered.



**** This is the First biblical reference to (The Angel of the Lord) !**

E. HE APPEARED TO ABRAHAM:

Gen. 18:1 NIV:

The Son of Promise

1 The LORD appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day.

Gen. 22:11-13 NIV:

11 But the angel of the LORD called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied.

12 "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."

13 Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son.

These were pivotal moments in Abraham's life. One involved the destruction of Sodom, while the other involved the last-minute salvation of Isaac.



F. HE appeared to Jacob:

Gen. 28:13 NIV:

13

There above it stood the LORD, and he said: "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying.

Gen. 32:24-32 NIV:

24 So Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him till daybreak.

25 When the man saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man.

26 Then the man said, "Let me go, for it is daybreak." But Jacob replied, "I will not let you go unless you bless me."

27 The man asked him, "What is your name?" "Jacob," he answered.

28 Then the man said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with humans and have overcome."

29 Jacob said, "Please tell me your name." But he replied, "Why do you ask my name?" Then he blessed him there.

30 So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "It is because I saw God face to face, and yet my life was spared."

31 The sun rose above him as he passed Peniel, and he was limping because of his hip.

32 Therefore to this day the Israelites do not eat the tendon attached to the socket of the hip, because the socket of Jacob's hip was touched near the tendon.

Gen. 48:16 NIV:

16 the Angel who has delivered me from all harm may he bless these boys. May they be called by my name and the names of my fathers Abraham and Isaac, and may they increase greatly on the earth."

G. HE appeared to **(Moses)** all of the three following occasions are connected to Mt. Sinai:

Ex. 3:2 NIV:

2 There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up.

Ex. 23:20 NIV:

The Angel and the Promises

20 "See, I am sending an angel ahead of you to guard you along the way and to bring you to the place I have prepared.

Ex. 33: 18-23 NIV:

18 Then Moses said, "Now show me your glory."

19 And the LORD said, "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the LORD, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.

20 But," he said, "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live."

21 Then the LORD said, "There is a place near me where you may stand on a rock.

22 When my glory passes by, I will put you in a cleft in the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by.

23 Then I will remove my hand and you will see my back; but my face must not be seen."

**H. HE appeared to Joshua, and HE calls himself -
“ The Captain of the Lord’s Host.”**

Josh. 5:13-15 NIV:

The Commander of the Army of the Lord

13 Now when Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand. Joshua went up to him and asked, "Are you for us or for our enemies?"

14 "Neither," he replied, "but as commander of the army of the LORD I have now come." Then Joshua fell facedown to the ground in reverence, and asked him, "What message does my Lord have for his servant?"

15 The commander of the LORD's army replied, "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy." And Joshua did so.



I. HE appeared to Gideon: JDG. 6: 11-24

Gideon

11 The angel of the LORD came and sat down under the oak in Ophrah that belonged to Joash the Abiezrite, where his son Gideon was threshing wheat in a winepress to keep it from the Midianites.

12 When the angel of the LORD appeared to Gideon, he said, "The LORD is with you, mighty warrior."

13 "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but if the LORD is with us, why has all this happened to us? Where are all his wonders that our ancestors told us about when they said, 'Did not the LORD bring us up out of Egypt?' But now the LORD has abandoned us and given us into the hand of Midian."

14 The LORD turned to him and said, "Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?"

15 "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but how can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family."

16 The LORD answered, "I will be with you, and you will strike down all the Midianites, leaving none alive."

17 Gideon replied, "If now I have found favor in your eyes, give me a sign that it is really you talking to me."

18 Please do not go away until I come back and bring my offering and set it before you." And the LORD said, "I will wait until you return."

19 Gideon went inside, prepared a young goat, and from an ephah of flour he made bread without yeast. Putting the meat in a basket and its broth in a pot, he brought them out and offered them to him under the oak.

20 The angel of God said to him, "Take the meat and the unleavened bread, place them on this rock, and pour out the broth." And Gideon did so.

21 Then the angel of the LORD touched the meat and the unleavened bread with the tip of the staff that was in his hand. Fire flared from the rock, consuming the meat and the bread. And the angel of the LORD disappeared.

22 When Gideon realized that it was the angel of the LORD, he exclaimed, "Alas, Sovereign LORD! I have seen the angel of the LORD face to face!"

23 But the LORD said to him, "Peace! Do not be afraid. You are not going to die."

24 So Gideon built an altar to the LORD there and called it The LORD Is Peace. To this day it stands in Ophrah of the Abiezrites.

J. HE appeared to Isaiah: Isa. 6:1-13.

Isaiah Called to Be a Prophet

1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple.

2 Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying.

3 And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."

4 At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

5 "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."

6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar.

7 With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."

8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

9 He said, "Go and tell this people: "Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving.'

10 Make the heart of this people calloused; make their ears dull and close their eyes. Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed."

11 Then I said, "For how long, Lord?" And he answered: "Until the cities lie ruined and without inhabitant, until the houses are left deserted and the fields ruined and ravaged,

12 until the LORD has sent everyone far away and the land is utterly forsaken.

13 And though a tenth remains in the land, it will again be laid waste. But as the terebinth and oak leave stumps when they are cut down, so the holy seed will be the stump in the land."

3. The Deity of our Lord as proffered by some:



A. The Nestorians believed that two persons actually resided in the body of Christ: the human person and the divine.

B. The EUTYCHIANS They took the opposite extreme and argued that both human and divine natures mingled to form a third nature, which was entirely different from the original two natures.

The true view of the Incarnation:

A. “ HE always says; I, ME, MINE.

He’s always addressed as Thou, thee, Thine.

HE is always spoken of as HE, HIS, HIM.

It was the same person to whom it was said, “ Thou Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundations of the earth and the heavens, are the works of Thine hands.”

v. The Miracles Involved in the Incarnation

The Bible declares that Jesus was equally divine and human, as if he had never been human, and equally human as if he had never been divine.

B. The Hypostatic Union: The Marriage of God to a Human Body.



Prophecies concerning the Incarnation:

A. By Isaiah the Prophet: Isa. 7:14 NIV:

14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

B. By Micah the Prophet: Micah 5:2 NIV:

The Coming Messiah

2 "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

C. As told to Joseph: Mt. 1:20-21 NIV:

20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

D. As told to the Shepherds: Lk. 2:25-32 NIV:

25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him.

26 It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

27 Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required,

28 Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

29 "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.

30 For my eyes have seen your salvation,

31 which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:

32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

E. As told to the Wise Men: Mt. 2:1-2 NIV:

Wise Men from the East

1 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem

2 and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

F. As told to Simeon: Lk. 2:25-32 NIV:

25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him.

26 It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

27 Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required,

28 Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

29 "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.

30 For my eyes have seen your salvation,

31 which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:

32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

G. As told by Anna: Lk. 2:38 NIV:

38 Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

45 So it is written: "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam, a life-giving spirit.

C. Almighty: Rev 1:8 NIV:

8 "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty."

D. Amen: Rev. 3:14 NIV:

To the Church in Laodicea

14 "To the angel of the church in Laodicea write: These are the words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation.

E. Author: Heb. 12:2 NIV:

2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.
