I created Program ACT, to address the immediate void, that's propounded upon the family, when a fallen hero, is killed in the line of duty.

My experience has been, that pursuant to the funeral and burial service, of said Hero, people must get back to the needs of their own lives and most times the families of these fallen Hero's are unintentionally forgotten.

To that end, I created a 52- Week Calendar Schedule, where the fallen's co-workers can sign up, for a given week, and go by the home of the fallen hero's family, to see if they're in need of anything: food, emotional support, mow the lawn, even if it's just to say hi, or sip a cup of coffee, throw ball with the kids (if any were left behind), or just to show their appreciation for what the family is going through and just keep an eye out for their families, that will mourn their deaths, for years.

- (1) Coordinator to download and place on a bulletin board a sign up sheet.
- (1) Volunteer that will sign up and go by to see the family and spend just ONE HOUR, a week (at anytime during that week that bodes well for all parties

Playing catch with the kids

Just going by and letting them know that you care, and pray with them
