Title: The most terrible Words that Human Ears can Ever Hear

Text: Matthew 25:31-34,

The Son of Man Will Judge the Nations

31 "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne.

32 All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

33 He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.

34 "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.

Introduction: God is love, but HE can be a Terrible God.

A. Psalms 27:1-4, 34:4-8, 17-19, 37:23-25:

The Way of the Righteous and the End of the Ungodly

1 Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers,

2 but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night.

3 That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers.

4 Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.

Psalms 34:4-8 NIV:

4I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears.

5Those who look to him are radiant; their faces are never covered with shame.

6This poor man called, and the LORD heard him; he saved him out of all his troubles.

7The angel of the LORD encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them.

8Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him.

Psalms 34:17-19 NIV:

17The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles.

18The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.

19The righteous person may have many troubles, but the LORD delivers him from them all;

Psalms 37:23-25 NIV:

²³The LORD makes firm the steps of the one who delights in him;

²⁴though he may stumble, he will not fall, for the LORD upholds him with his hand.

⁵I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread.

B. Romans 8:35-39:

³⁵Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?

³⁶As it is written: "For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

³⁸For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers,

³⁹neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

C. 2 Cor. 1:3-4: All comfort and help comes from God.

II. Whom was Jesus?



2 Cor. 1:1-4:

1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, To the church of God in Corinth, together with all his holy people throughout Achaia:

Praise to the God of All Comfort

2 Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

3Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort,

4who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

A. Matthew 25:31: Jesus calls himself: The Son of Man.

The Son of Man Will Judge the Nations

31"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne.

B. Matthew 25:34: Jesus calls himself: A King.

"Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.'

C. MATTHEW 25:37: Jesus calls himself: The Lord.

37"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?'

III. **Whom Jesus Wasn't :**

If Jesus were a lunatic, a mentally ill man, a madman, a false prophet, or an ungodly preacher, then these aforementioned attributes would disqualify him from us listening to him.

A. Luke 7:31-32:

V 31. To what will I compare this infantile generation to?

V 32. They (men and women) are acting as if they are on a day off from school, and as if they are at the marketplace playing games of (pop-piper), or in a funeral parlor with each other.

In other words, neither group had a balanced to them.

i.e. Some people want religion to be happy, while others want it to be sad.

Jesus is love, but He's also a consuming Fire!



IV. What was the opinion of Jesus by some?

1. A Glutton

2. A Winebibber

3. A friend of Publicans

4. A friend of Sinners

A. Luke 7:34-35:

34The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and you say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners.'

35But wisdom is proved right by all her children."

Comparing the opinions of Jesus as expressed by individuals from that era.

A. LUKE 7:33:

John the Baptist, was considered an UN-Holy man, because he wouldn't socialize.

Moreover, he spent his entire time devoted to the ministry.



B. LUKE 7:34:

Jesus went everywhere where he was invited, and HE was considered a bum, a moocher, a glutton, and a winebibber.

VI. Was Jesus demon possessed?



A. Luke 11:14-15:

Jesus and Beelzebul

14 Jesus was driving out a demon that was mute. When the demon left, the man who had been mute spoke, and the crowd was amazed.

15 But some of them said, "By Beelzebul, the prince of demons, he is driving out demons."

Some claimed that Jesus was indeed possessed by a demon, and that the power he possessed was given to him by Satan. It was only then that he was able to perform the miracles he had done.

VII. Was Jesus A Criminal?

A. Acts 2:22-23:

22 "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know.

23 This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross.

Jesus, who wasn't a moocher, winebibber, false prophet, bum, glutton, was crucified as an innocent man.

VIII. The Deity of our Lord Christ Jesus:



A. Matthew 25:31:

The Son of Man Will Judge the Nations

31 "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne.

1. The preacher speaking is the Son of Man; (God Incarnate), God Himself.
2. Why does God refer to Himself as the Son of Man?

Because one of the members of Trinity, had to take the form of flesh, to communicate, the plan of salvation to man.

3. Matthew 26:63-65:

Pursuant to His trial before the Sanhedrin, Jesus when asked said "Yes, I am the Son of Man." " The God Man! "

IX. Will Jesus return again?



A. Phil. 2:9-10:

V 9. The Son of Man; one of the names of God.

V 10. Even the angels in heaven bow when they see the presence of Jesus. When he returns to Earth, everyone here will bow to Jesus. When he visits Hell, everyone there will also bow to Jesus.

B. 2 Thess. 2:1-8 NIV:

1 Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

2 Grace and peace to you from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Thanksgiving and Prayer

3 We ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love all of you have for one another is increasing.

4 Therefore, among God's churches we boast about your perseverance and faith in all the persecutions and trials you are enduring.

5 All this is evidence that God's judgment is right, and as a result you will be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are suffering.

6 God is just: He will pay back trouble to those who trouble you

7 and give relief to you who are troubled, and to us as well. This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with his powerful angels.

8 He will punish those who do not know God and do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus.

C. Revelation 1:7 NIV:

7"Look, he is coming with the clouds," and "every eye will see him, even those who pierced him"; and all peoples on earth "will mourn because of him." So shall it be! Amen.

Everyone will witness the second coming of Jesus.

He is not coming to spread the gospel of forgiveness, or talk about repentance, nor to discuss salvation.

Instead, he is returning to execute judgment on all individuals. Jesus will judge the world in righteousness.



X. Will people truly go to hell, and will they suffer eternal punishment?



A. Matthew 13:41-42:

41The Son of Man will send out his angels, and they will weed out of his kingdom everything that causes sin and all who do evil.

42They will throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

The angels will gather all people from all four corners of the earth, and pursuant to their trials, **the angels at the command of God will deposit all the wicked in the everlasting fire.**



B. Matthew 13:47-50:

Hell awaits the wicked!

The Parable of the Dragnet

47"Once again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was let down into the lake and caught all kinds of fish.

48When it was full, the fishermen pulled it up on the shore. Then they sat down and collected the good fish in baskets, but threw the bad away.

49This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous

50and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

One day, people will have God play a major role in their respective lives, whether they want Him to or not.

C. Matthew 22:1-13:

The Parable of the Wedding Feast

1 Jesus spoke to them again in parables, saying:

2 "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son.

3 He sent his servants to those who had been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come.

4 "Then he sent some more servants and said, 'Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner: My oxen and fattened cattle have been butchered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet.'

5 "But they paid no attention and went off one to his field, another to his business.

6 The rest seized his servants, mistreated them and killed them.

7 The king was enraged. He sent his army and destroyed those murderers and burned their city.

8 "Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding banquet is ready, but those I invited did not deserve to come.

9 So go to the street corners and invite to the banquet anyone you find.'

10 So the servants went out into the streets and gathered all the people they could find, the bad as well as the good, and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

11 "But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes.

12 He asked, 'How did you get in here without wedding clothes, friend?' The man was speechless.

13 "Then the king told the attendants, 'Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

V 1-11:

Jesus has been calling people for over 2,000 years.

V 12-13:

People whom are cosmetic Christians will be exposed and judged by God.

D. 2 Cor. 5:10-11:

10For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

11Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade others. What we are is plain to God, and I hope it is also plain to your conscience.
