The United States military definition in the Department of Defense Dictionary of Military and Associated Terms comes from Joint Publication 3-05.1 –

Joint Special Operations Task Force Operations (JP 3-05.1).

[3] JP 3-05.1 defines a "special mission unit" as "a generic term to represent a group of operations and support personnel from designated organizations that is task-organized to perform highly classified activities".

[4] The U.S. government does not acknowledge which units specifically are designated as special missions units,

[5] only that they have special mission units within the Joint Special Operations Command (JSOC), which is part of U.S. Special Operations Command (SOCOM).

In the early 1990s commander in chief of SOCOM, General Carl Stiner, identified both Delta Force and SEAL Team Six as permanently assigned special mission units in congressional testimony and public statements.

[6] In 1998, Under Secretary of Defense for Policy Walter B. Slocombe publicly referred to special mission units during a briefing to the Senate Armed Services Committee:

"We have designated special mission units that are specifically manned, equipped and trained to deal with a wide variety of transnational threats" and "These units, assigned to or under the operational control of the U.S. Special Operations Command, are focused primarily on those special operations and supporting functions that combat terrorism and actively counter terrorist use of weapons of mass destruction.

These units are on alert every day of the year and have worked extensively with their interagency counterparts."[7]

1 Samuel 11:11 New International Version

11 The next day Saul separated his men into three divisions; during the last watch of the night they broke into the camp of the Ammonites and slaughtered them until the heat of the day. Those who survived were scattered, so that no two of them were left together.

1 Samuel 13:2 New International Version

2 Saul chose three thousand men from Israel; two thousand were with him at Mikmash and in the hill country of Bethel, and a thousand were with Jonathan at Gibeah in Benjamin. The rest of the men he sent back to their homes.

1 Samuel 16:21 New International Version

21 David came to Saul and entered his service. Saul liked him very much, and David became one of his armor-bearers.

1 Samuel 17:31-53 New International Version

- 31 What David said was overheard and reported to Saul, and Saul sent for him.
- 32 David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him."
- 33 Saul replied, "You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth."
- 34 But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock,
- 35 I went after it, struck it and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it.
- 36 Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God.

37 The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

Saul said to David, "Go, and the Lord be with you."

- 38 Then Saul dressed David in his own tunic. He put a coat of armor on him and a bronze helmet on his head.
- 39 David fastened on his sword over the tunic and tried walking around, because he was not used to them. "I cannot go in these," he said to Saul, "because I am not used to them." So he took them off.
- 40 Then he took his staff in his hand, chose five smooth stones from the stream, put them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag and, with his sling in his hand, approached the Philistine.
- 41 Meanwhile, the Philistine, with his shield bearer in front of him, kept coming closer to David.
- 42 He looked David over and saw that he was little more than a boy, glowing with health and handsome, and he despised him.
- 43 He said to David, "Am I a dog, that you come at me with sticks?" And the Philistine cursed David by his gods.
- 44 "Come here," he said, "and I'll give your flesh to the birds and the wild animals!"
- 45 David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied.



- 46 This day the Lord will deliver you into my hands, and I'll strike you down and cut off your head. This very day I will give the carcasses of the Philistine army to the birds and the wild animals, and the whole world will know that there is a God in Israel.
- 47 All those gathered here will know that it is not by sword or spear that the Lord saves; for the battle is the Lord's, and he will give all of you into our hands."
- 48 As the Philistine moved closer to attack him, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet him.
- 49 Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, he slung it and struck the Philistine on the forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell facedown on the ground.
- 50 So David triumphed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone; without a sword in his hand he struck down the Philistine and killed him.
- 51 David ran and stood over him. He took hold of the Philistine's sword and drew it from the sheath. After he killed him, he cut off his head with the sword. When the Philistines saw that their hero was dead, they turned and ran.
- 52 Then the men of Israel and Judah surged forward with a shout and pursued the Philistines to the entrance of Gath_[a] and to the gates of Ekron. Their dead were strewn along the Shaaraim road to Gath and Ekron.
- 53 When the Israelites returned from chasing the Philistines, they plundered their camp.

Numbers 13:2 New International Version

2 "Send some men to explore the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelites. From each ancestral tribe send one of its leaders."

Numbers 13:16 New International Version

16 These are the names of the men Moses sent to explore the land. (Moses gave Hoshea son of Nun the name Joshua.)

Numbers 13:17 New International Version

17 When Moses sent them to explore Canaan, he said, "Go up through the Negev and on into the hill country.

Numbers 14:36 New International Version

36 So the men Moses had sent to explore the land, who returned and made the whole community grumble against him by spreading a bad report about it—

Numbers 14:38 New International Version

38 Of the men who went to explore the land, only Joshua son of Nun and Caleb son of Jephunneh survived.

Numbers 21:32 New International Version

32 After Moses had sent spies to Jazer, the Israelites captured its surrounding settlements and drove out the Amorites who were there.

Deuteronomy 1:22 New International Version

22 Then all of you came to me and said, "Let us send men ahead to spy out the land for us and bring back a report about the route we are to take and the towns we will come to."

Deuteronomy 1:33 New International Version

33 who went ahead of you on your journey, in fire by night and in a cloud by day, to search out places for you to camp and to show you the way you should go.

Joshua 2:1 New International Version

Rahab and the Spies

2 Then Joshua son of Nun secretly sent two spies from Shittim. "Go, look over the land," he said, "especially Jericho." So they went and entered the house of a prostitute named Rahab and stayed there.

Joshua 2:2 New International Version

2 The king of Jericho was told, "Look, some of the Israelites have come here tonight to spy out the land."

Joshua 2:3 New International Version

3 So the king of Jericho sent this message to Rahab: "Bring out the men who came to you and entered your house, because they have come to spy out the whole land."

Joshua 7:2 New International Version

2 Now Joshua sent men from Jericho to Ai, which is near Beth Aven to the east of Bethel, and told them, "Go up and spy out the region." So the men went up and spied out Ai.

Deuteronomy 20 New International Version Going to War



20 When you go to war against your enemies and see horses and chariots and an army greater than yours, do not be afraid of them, because the Lord your God, who brought you up out of Egypt, will be with you.

2 When you are about to go into battle, the priest shall come forward and address the army.

- 3 He shall say: "Hear, Israel: Today you are going into battle against your enemies. Do not be fainthearted or afraid; do not panic or be terrified by them.
- 4 For the Lord your God is the one who goes with you to fight for you against your enemies to give you victory."
- 5 The officers shall say to the army: "Has anyone built a new house and not yet begun to live in it? Let him go home, or he may die in battle and someone else may begin to live in it.
- 6 Has anyone planted a vineyard and not begun to enjoy it? Let him go home, or he may die in battle and someone else enjoy it.
- 7 Has anyone become pledged to a woman and not married her? Let him go home, or he may die in battle and someone else marry her."
- 8 Then the officers shall add, "Is anyone afraid or fainthearted? Let him go home so that his fellow soldiers will not become disheartened too."
- 9 When the officers have finished speaking to the army, they shall appoint commanders over it.
- 10 When you march up to attack a city, make its people an offer of peace.
- 11 If they accept and open their gates, all the people in it shall be subject to forced labor and shall work for you.
- 12 If they refuse to make peace and they engage you in battle, lay siege to that city.
- 13 When the Lord your God delivers it into your hand, put to the sword all the men in it.
- 14 As for the women, the children, the livestock and everything else in the city, you may take these as plunder for yourselves. And you may use the plunder the Lord your God gives you from your enemies.

15 This is how you are to treat all the cities that are at a distance from you and do not belong to the nations nearby.

16 However, in the cities of the nations the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance, do not leave alive anything that breathes.

17 Completely destroy[a] them—the Hittites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites—as the Lord your God has commanded you.

18 Otherwise, they will teach you to follow all the detestable things they do in worshiping their gods, and you will sin against the Lord your God.

19 When you lay siege to a city for a long time, fighting against it to capture it, do not destroy its trees by putting an ax to them, because you can eat their fruit. Do not cut them down. Are the trees people, that you should besiege them?[b]

20 However, you may cut down trees that you know are not fruit trees and use them to build siege works until the city at war with you falls.
